You must register and pick up maps and directions for all events at the meeting room (behind the office) at:

Registration will be open the following hours:

Friday 8:00 – 12:00 pm Saturday 7:00 – 9:00 am Sunday 7:00 – 9:00 am

Finish will be open during these hours:

Friday 12:00 – 4:00 pm Saturday 12:00 – 4:00 pm Sunday 12:00 – 3:00 pm

Sunday we will begin sweeping Grindstone Trail, Turkey Canyon & Argentina Canyon at 10:00 am. We will begin sweeping Big Bonito at 8:00. Please note if you start later than the sweeps there will be no ribbons to follow on Sunday.

Volunteers: Please check the registration form if you are available to volunteer and we will email you with more details. We expect to have a volunteer meeting on Wednesday 10/8 at 7:30 pm.


Eligibility: All persons and ages are welcome. Children under legal age must be accompanied by an adult. None of these events are suitable for strollers or wheelchairs.

No Refunds: There will be no refunds for no shows and no transferring of fees between events. There will also be no refunds for those refused a start stamp due to noncompliance with minimum water requirements.

Event Fees: \$3.00 per walk.

Safety: PLEASE DO NOT HIKE ALONE. You are in the wilderness so you need to be alert and aware of your surroundings. Cell phone service is spotty. Smoking is banned in the forest due to threat of forest fires.

Because of the high altitudes, we recommend arriving a day or two early to get yourself acclimated. Be sure to stay hydrated. If feeling extreme symptoms of altitude sickness, descend immediately.

Grindstone Lake

Start Point: Grindstone Trailhead

 $\textbf{Registration/Finish:} \ \textbf{High Country Lodge}.$

Distances: 6km (out & back) or 12km (loop)

Rated: 3B (moderate) Elevation Gain: 886'.

Special Programs: Lakes & Reservoirs and

Watertowers.

Highlights: Beautiful views of the lake and surrounding area. If you are lucky you might catch a glimpse of the wildlife that frequents the area.

Trail Description: This walk is the nearest and lowest altitude hike. It is a forested loop up and down Grindstone Canyon with beautiful views of the lake and Mountains. The 6k trail is forested and lakeside

 $\textbf{Restrooms:} \ \text{Port-o-potties at start/finish}.$

Worker's Walk: 8:00 am on Wednesday 10/8.

Meet at trailhead parking lot.

Directions: From High Country Lodge, head south on Mechem (Hwy 48) to the end of the road. Turn right on Main Road. At the traffic circle, drive counter-clockwise 3/4 around, then exit right to D St. At the next block, veer right to stay on D St. At 5th Street turn on Resort Dr. Drive down Resort Dr. and turn right at the Grindstone Lake sign. Trailhead in upper parking lot. (15 minutes from High Country Lodge.)



Turkey Canyon

Start Point: Turkey Canyon Trailhead

 $\textbf{Registration/Finish:} \ \textbf{High Country Lodge}.$

Distances: 5km or 10km (out-and-back)

Rated: 3C (moderate) Elevation Gain: 1,190'.

Special Programs: None

Highlights: Hike through lush green forests and

look for hidden caves.

Trail Description: This is a popular hike in the upper Bonito Creek drainage that has multiple creek crossing and beautiful forest scenery. Be prepared for the steep climb as you approach the 10k turn around.

Restrooms: Vault toilets at start/finish.

Worker's Walk: 8:00 am on Wednesday 10/8.

Meet at trailhead parking lot.

Directions: rom High Country Lodge, take Hwy 48 north approximately 4.3 miles to Highway 37. Turn left on Hwy 37 and go approx 1.3 miles to the intersection with Bonito Lake Road (Forest Road 107). Turn left on Forest Road 107 and follow it approx 8.4 miles to the trailhead located on your right near the end of the road. Park in campground just beyond trailhead. The road is narrow, but paved until the final 4 miles. The last 4 miles are improved dirt but passable by car. (14 miles/40 minutes from High Country Lodge.)



Argentina Canyon

Start Point: Argentina Trailhead

Registration/Finish: High Country Lodge.

Distances: 5km (out & back), 8 or 10km (loop)

Rated: 3C (moderate) Elevation Gain: 1,300'.

Special Programs: None

Highlights: Opportunity to see old silver mines. Views of Nogal Peak and the Malpais Lava Flow and the upper Bonito Creek drainage.

Trail Description: This is a popular hike featuring gorgeous forest scenery, running streams and alpine meadows. Elk sightings are not uncommon. The 8km loop cuts off the steep climb to the summit.

Restrooms: Vault toilets at start/finish.

Worker's Walk: 8:00 am on Thursday 10/9.

Meet at trailhead parking lot.

Directions: From High Country Lodge, take Hwy 48 north approximately 4.3 miles to Highway 37. Turn left on Hwy 37 and go approx 1.3 miles to the intersection with Bonito Lake Road (Forest Road 107). Turn left on Forest Road 107 and follow it approx 8.4 miles to the very end of the road. Park near Big Bonito trailhead and walk on road back to Argentina trailhead. The road is narrow, but paved until the final 4 miles. The last 4 miles are improved dirt but passable by car. (14 miles/40 minutes from High Country Lodge.)



Big Bonito

Start Point: Big Bonito Trailhead

Registration/Finish: High Country Lodge.

Distances: 6 or 10km (out & back) or 17km (loop)

Rated: 4C (strenuous) Elevation Gain: 2,173'.

Special Programs: None

Highlights: Views of Nogal Peak and White Horse

Hill. Opportunities to see elk and deer.

Trail Description: This is a strenuous 8-hour hike in the White Mountain Wilderness, starting along the Bonita Creek and continues along abandoned mines before climbing to the summit at the Crest Trail.

Restrooms: Vault toilets at start/finish.

Worker's Walk: 8:00 am on Thursday 10/9.

Meet at trailhead parking lot.

Directions: From High Country Lodge, take Hwy 48 north approximately 4.3 miles to Highway 37. Turn left on Hwy 37 and go approx 1.3 miles to the intersection with Bonito Lake Road (Forest Road 107). Turn left on Forest Road 107 and follow it approx 8.4 miles to the very end of the road to the Big Bonito trailhead. The road is narrow, but paved until the final 4 miles. The last 4 miles are improved dirt but passable by car. (14 miles / 40 minutes from High Country Lodge.)


