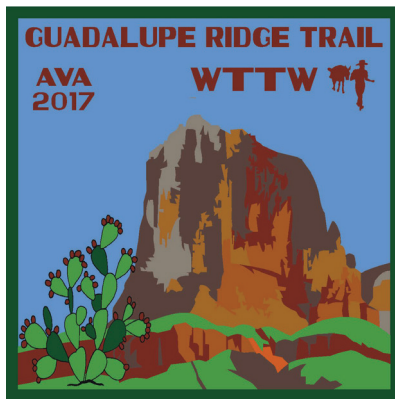


Guadalupe Mountains National Park is a remote, rugged wilderness park located in far West Texas on U.S. Highway 62/180, between El Paso, Texas and Carlsbad, New Mexico. There are no restaurants, service stations, or overnight lodging (except camping) available in Guadalupe Mountains National Park. The closest location for ice, groceries, showers, and lodging is 35 miles northeast in Whites City, New Mexico. Gasoline is also available there. Consider the park's remote location and plan your trip wisely.

Guadalupe Ridge Trail (GRT): Ribbon cutting and dedication on May 6, 2017. Experience the wilds of Texas and New Mexico high country. This newly designated trail system winds through two national parks, a national forest and the desert landscape of BLM encompassing over 100 miles. It includes Guadalupe National Park, Sitting Bull Falls in Lincoln National Forest and continues through the rugged backcountry to Carlsbad Caverns National Park. Join us this year as we hike the highlights of this newly designated trail system.

Locations: Guadalupe Mountains National Park Sitting Bull Falls and Carlsbad Caverns. Note all times listed will be in the Mountain Time Zone.

Eligibility: All persons and ages are welcome. Children under legal age must be accompanied by an adult. None of these events are suitable for strollers or wheelchairs. No smoking on the trails.

No Refunds: There will be no refunds for no shows and no transferring of fees between events. There will also be no refunds for those refused a start stamp due to non-compliance with minimum water requirements.

Event Fees: \$3.00 per walk (includes AVA credit).

Park Fees: Guadalupe Mountains National Park is \$5 per person and is good for 7 days. Sitting Bull Falls is \$5 per vehicle, per day. Carlsbad Caverns entrance fee is \$10 per person. National Park Passes accepted. You are responsible for paying your own park fees.

Pets: No pets allowed on trails in the national park.

Sitting Bull Falls

Dates: Friday, October 6, 2010

Walk Directors: Linda Fields, Joe Noonan

Start Point: Sitting Bull Falls Recreation Area
Eddy County, New Mexico (Lincoln National Forest)

Start Times: 8:30 am - 10:30 am

Finish Time: 3:00 pm

Distances: 5K (out & back) or 14K (loop)

Rated: 2D (rugged, elevation gain: 1,000')

Highlights: Experience an oasis hidden in the midst of the desert where a beautiful 130-foot waterfall pours over canyon walls. Also spring fed ponds and grottos.

Trail Description: The trail begins with a gradual uphill climb to the top of Sitting Bull Falls. 5K turnaround will be a beautiful grotto with spring fed ponds. The 14K will continue up White Oak Trail with a 1,000' elevation gain and beautiful views. Then follow switchbacks down to White Oak Springs. Finish on Last Chance Canyon Trail back to the finish. After the walk, visit and explore the base of the falls.

Worker's Walk: Thursday, Oct. 5th @ 8:30 am
Sitting Bull Falls Recreation Area.

Directions: (40.3 miles / 1 h 10 min from Carlsbad)
From Carlsbad, follow US-180/62 W southwest about 8.1 miles. Turn right on Co. Rd 408/Dark Canyon Rd. In about 22.5 miles, turn left on NM-137/Queens Hwy for 1.9 miles. Right at Co. Rd 409/Sitting Bull Falls Rd for 7.6 miles. (mileage is approximate)

Guadalupe Peak

Dates: Saturday, October 7, 2010

Walk Directors: Linda Fields, Dianne Duke

Start Point: Pine Springs Visitor's Center
Guadalupe Mountains National Park Headquarters, TX

Start Times: 8:00 am - 9:00 am

Finish Time: 3:00 pm

Distances: up to 17K (out & back)

Rated: 4E (strenuous, elevation gain: 3,000')

Highlights: Fantastic views, several eco-systems from high desert to high forests. AA Monument.

Trail Description: Trail climbs to the "Top of Texas" at 8,749'. On a clear day, you can see the Davis Mountains. At the summit, there is a register and a small monument erected by American Airlines to commemorate the first transcontinental mail route which went through Guadalupe Pass. Outstanding views. Trail is good, but steep. Plan on 6 to 7 hour hike.

Special Programs: Amphitheatres, Doin' The Louisiana Purchase, Honoring Our Flag, National Parks Centennial Challenge

Worker's Walk: No worker's walk for this event. Volunteer assignments will be given out at Smith Spring workers' walk.

Directions: (51.5 miles / 50 min from Carlsbad)
Follow U.S. Highway 62/180 56 miles southwest of Carlsbad, New Mexico to Park headquarters and Pine Springs Visitors Center. (Park fee: \$5 per person for duration of your stay. Keep stub in car window.)



Smith Springs

Dates: Saturday, October 7, 2017

Walk Directors: Randy Baker & Margie Kent

Start Point: Frijole Ranch
Guadalupe Mountains National Park, Texas

Start Time: 8:00 am - 10:00 am

Finish Time: 3:00 pm

Distances: 5 km or 10 km

Rated: 2C (easy to moderate)

Highlights: Extraordinary desert oasis. So much water seeps out it forms a small waterfall and live stream.

Trail Description: The rocky trail dips into a wash then gradually climbs almost 400 feet. After winding across a yucca- and cacti-covered hillside, the trail enters a lush riparian zone where Smith Spring appears below layers of percolating limestone. The seeping spring is surrounded by maidenhair fern and big-tooth maple and a good place to rest and spot wildlife.

Special Programs: Doin' The Louisiana Purchase, National Parks Centennial Challenge

Workers' Walk: 8:00 am Wednesday, October 4th. We will only walk this trail only, but will give volunteer assignments for both Smith Springs and Guadalupe Peak.

Directions: (54 miles / 55 min from Carlsbad)
Drive north from the main entrance of Guadalupe Mountains National Park on US 62/180 for one mile and turn left (north). The turnoff is well signed as Frijole Ranch. Head up the well-maintained gravel road for about 0.5 miles until it dead-ends at museum. (Park fee: \$5 per person for duration of your stay. Keep stub in car window.)



Guano Trail / Carlsbad Caverns

Dates: Sunday, October 8, 2017

Walk Directors: Helen Hull, Gary Silkworth

Start Point: Whites City RV Park, New Mexico

Start Time: 7:00 am - 8:00 am (for 14km & 20km)
7:00 am - 9:00 am (for 5 & 7km)

Finish Time: 12:00 pm

Distances: 5, 7, 14 and up to 20 km options

Rated: 2C (moderate) gradual 700' elevation gain.

Highlights: Visit the seldom seen trail above Carlsbad National Park and have the option of including the Caverns tour as part of your hike.

Trail Description: Hike the Old Guano Road trail from Whites City to the Caverns or the reverse from Caverns to Whites City, a distance of 7K each way. Once at the Caverns, take an optional tour of the caverns for an additional 2K, 4K, or 6K (National Park Pass or fee required). Shuttle service will be available to top (if hiking down), or from top back to Whites City (if hiking up).

This is a "design your own hike". 5K (in/out), 7K (up or down between White's City and Caverns), 14K (up and down), add 2-6K (Cavern options) for a total of 20K. Handouts will be available on Friday & Saturday so you can study the various options.

Special Programs: Amphitheatres, National Parks Centennial Challenge

19 Carlsbad Cavern Hwy (US-62), then 1/4 mile West on Hwy-7 (road to Carlsbad Cavern Nat'l Park). Look for signs to parking and check-in table
